Community and District:

The Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District is comprised of Egg Harbor City, Galloway, Hamilton and Mullica Townships. It is the largest school district in the area and in the State of New Jersey. The district operates three comprehensive high schools Grades 9–12, Absegami, Cedar Creek and Oakcrest. The district is located in Atlantic County approximately 12 miles west of Atlantic City and is a sixty minute drive from Philadelphia. This area is semi-rural and suburban with agriculture and light service industries. The Atlantic County Institute of Technology, Atlantic Cape Community College and Richard Stockton College are located within the district's geographic boundaries.

The School:

Absegami High School is a four-year comprehensive, public high school with a student population of approximately 1900. The school is one of three high schools in the Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District. The minimum number of credits for graduation is 120 and include all New Jersey State requirements. The school year consists of four marking periods with graduation in June.

Curriculum Features:

Course offerings are designed to meet the student's individual needs and abilities. The varied curriculum prepares students to achieve their post-secondary educational and career goals. Numerous Advanced Placement and Honors level courses are available through various grade levels. The Advanced Placement Program is offered through the English, Mathematics, Science, World Language and Social Studies curriculums.

GPA/Class Rank:

The cumulative average of a students' final grade is defined as their Grade Point Average. A students' GPA is determined by averaging the numerical grades earned for all courses. A student's un-weighted GPA can range from 50-100. A weighted GPA is calculated by adding 5 points to the final grade of an Honors course and 10 points to the final grade of an Advanced Placement course. The weighted GPA is used when determining class rank. Both the weighted and unweighted GPA and class rank are cumulative by semester over a four year period.

Co-Curricular Program

Absegami High School offers the opportunity to become involved in twenty seven NJSIAA varsity athletic programs and numerous extra-curricular activities. Participation in these programs develops leadership skills and involves our students in community service activities.
