If an alert is issued, school administration will work in conjunction with the Galloway Township Police Department or other Emergency Responders to provide for the safety and security of all our students and staff.

Depending upon the nature of the incident and consultation with emergency responders, we will implement one of the responses in accordance with our Emergency Plan.

To prepare for emergencies, Absegami's staff and students will practice various drills throughout the school year.

What should parents do if an incident occurs at school?

If an incident occurs, it is only natural for parents and guardians to want to rush to the school. However, you must be careful to avoid hampering the work of the school and public safety officials. Those officials will be working diligently to resolve the situation, maintain the highest safety standards and protect your child.

Parents and guardians can help manage a crisis situation in the following ways:

Remain calm. Do your best to cooperate with school and public safety officials.

Keep roads clear. Be aware that heavy traffic or parking congestion in front of a school building could hamper emergency response and communication efforts. Our access road must remain clear for emergency vehicles.

Be patient. Students will be released to their parents, guardians, or emergency contact persons as soon as it is safe to do so.

Please remember, a crisis situation must be handled in an orderly manner so that we can protect and account for all students.

Please ensure that the school always has an up-to-date information for emergency contact.

Non-Crisis Early Dismissal

Your child cannot be released to another without prior written and verbal parent/guardian approval.

Please contact the school with concerns about your child in the event of an emergency situation and unscheduled dismissals.

Talk with your child often about the importance of good, safe decisions in our schools. Respect for self and others in our school and community can not be stressed too often.
